Rate Hearing

Chairman Krommenhoek opened the CTSA Rate Hearing at 6:32 pm. Mr. Colantano reported the 2020 User Rates at \$520.00 per year per equivalent dwelling unit (EDU) based on the 2020 budget adopted by the Authority and approved by the State of New Jersey. Mr. Colantano noted this is an increase of just under two percent from the 2019 user fee of \$510.00. (It is noted Mr. Schneider entered the meeting at 6:35 p.m.) A base user fee was previously established to be charged for unused reserved capacity. This was calculated using debt service and capital reserve. This calculates to \$52.25 per EDU. A capital contribution was not budgeted for this year therefore, the base user fee is lower this year. Chairman Krommenhoek moved and Katrin Glode-Sethna seconded a motion to approve the 2020 user rate at \$520.00 per year for each EDU and the base user fee at \$52.25 per EDU. There being no further discussion, the roll was called.

Mr. Colantano presented the connection fee calculation for 2020. The connection fee will decrease from \$2,918.74 per equivalent dwelling unit (EDU) to \$2,918.29. This is based on the calculation of the total capital cost and debt service accumulated divided by the number of EDUs billed at the end of the year. Mr. Colantano noted the decrease is due to less debt and increase in EDUs. Katrin Glode-Sethna moved and Chairman Krommenhoek seconded a motion to approve the 2020 connection fee of \$2,918.29 per EDU. There being no further discussion, the roll was called.

Capital Budget Plan

Mr. Parr reported the float rack pulled out of its anchorage and the discharge pipe seal is leaking groundwater into the wet well at the Hamden Road pump station. This has the potential to create a public health, safety and welfare issue if not repaired immediately. NSU submitted a proposal in the amount of \$3,166.00 for the emergency repairs. The Authority's engineer has reviewed the proposal and believes it is fair and reasonable. Mr. Colantano noted funds exist for said repairs. It is noted this is not a capital expense. Peter Geiger moved and Katrin Glode-Sethna seconded the motion to accept the proposal from Natural Systems Utilities in the amount of \$3,166.00 to replace the pump guide rails, repair the float rack and reseal the discharge pipe at the Hamden Road pump station. There being no further discussion, the roll was called.

Operator's Report

Mr. Parr reported all stations are operational and alarms were tested. The generator block heaters were replaced at Water's Edge and Deer Meadow. A high-level alarm was received from Cryan's due to a faulty control circuit breaker. The breaker was replaced. During routine inspection the operator noticed reduced pump flow rates at Water's Edge. Pumps were pulled and inspected. Nothing significant was found. NSU will keep a close eye on this.

Mr. Parr requested the Authority obtain bids for Wet Well Cleaning On-Call Services. Bids were received from Russell Reid Waste Hauling (\$11,630.00), and National Water Main Cleaning Co. (\$38,120.00). The bids were reviewed by the CTSA engineer and attorney. At the advice of the Authority's Consulting Engineers, the Authority has determined to accept the low bid of Russell Reid in the amount of \$11,630.00. The contract is renewable for a three year time period at an increase of 3% each year. Chairman Krommenhoek moved and Katrin Glode-Sethna seconded the motion to accept the bid of Russell Reid for on-call wet well cleaning in the amount of \$11,630.00. There being no further discussion, the roll was called.
