New Business

Operator's Report

Mr. Parr provided a written report. In the report, all stations are operational, have been inspected weekly, data collected, and baskets cleaned. High level alarms were tested. Additionally, the following activities/issues were reported:

- Water's Edge Pump 2 was removed for evaluation and the new one was installed.
- P3 performed Major service to the generators at Cramer's Creek, DOT, Mews, Hamden Rd. and Maple Ave.
- A new winch was installed at the Mews.
- Mews Pump 1 tripped out due to rags on 5/17, 28 and 6/2 Pump was pulled and cleaned by NSU Services.
- During routine testing of the high-level float at DOT, the operator found the float was faulty. NSU Services replaced the high-level float.
- There were power failures on 5/6, 9, & 11^{th} at various pump stations.
- May 16th NSU received a high-level/backup float alarm at Stem. The transducer was not reading the wetwell correctly causing the level in the wetwell to go high. The transducer was removed and cleaned of the rags that had accumulated. The issue was resolved.

Mr. Parr provided quotes for repair and replacement for pumps at Water's Edge and the Mews. Water's Edge pump repair cost is \$4,385, replacement is \$10,410. The pump is 17 years old. The Mews pump is 11 years old. Cost to repair is \$3,468, replacement is \$6,920. A discussion ensued regarding the age and estimates provided.

Chairman Krommenhoek moved and Edward Schneider seconded the motion to approve the purchase of a new pump from Reiner Pump Systems for the Mews pump station at a cost of not to exceed \$7,500. It is noted Reiner Pump Systems is a vendor with the North Jersey Wastewater Cooperative. There being no further discussion, the roll was called.
