Law Enforcement Advises Public How to Report Drone Activity in the Area

Clinton Township Police Chief, Thomas A. DeRosa, issued the following public statement on recent drone activity observed in Clinton Township and surrounding areas.

County and local law enforcement agencies are aware of the recurring reports of drone activity around Clinton Township and acknowledge the public's concern about these repeated sightings.

This Department, working in close cooperation with the FBI-Newark, New Jersey State Police, and the New Jersey Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness partners, seeks to reassure the public that we will continue to monitor and investigate the drone activity.

At this time, there continues to be no known threat to public safety.

The FBI and the New Jersey State Police are asking the public to report any information related to the recent sightings of possible drones.
